MEDICAL TREATMENT VISA (Schengen from 1 to 90 days)

Applicants who are citizens of countries other than Uganda, Rwanda, and/or Burundi are required to present a valid residence permit issued by the relevant authorities. These permits include a work permit, a student visa, and/or a dependent family member's permit.

- Long-stay visa application form duly completed
- Valid passport, with residual validity of at least three months beyond the planned travel dates
- A recent passport-sized photograph with a white background (size [ICAO](#))
- Clear photocopy of the personal data page of your passport, together with copies of recent visas and entry/exit stamps, clearly showing the actual size of the document
- Flight booking
- Proof of accommodation for the entire duration of your stay
- Personal bank statement stamped by the bank and covering the last three months
- Valid travel health insurance covering the entire planned travel period, including transfer dates
- Consular fees payable only in cash and in USD on the day of the visa appointment

Specific documents

- Medical report issued by a recognized local hospital facility, clearly describing the patient's health conditions
- Appointment letter from the receiving Italian hospital confirming the scheduled visit or treatment
- Confirmation letter from the receiving Italian hospital certifying acceptance for treatment and detailing planned medical care.
- Proof from the Italian healthcare facility that a security deposit of 30% of the total estimated cost of the requested healthcare services has been received;
- Proof of sufficient financial means, such as recent bank statements or a letter of guarantee (sponsorship) to cover medical and living expenses
- Supporting documentation for any accompanying person(s), where applicable.

MINORS

- Copy of birth certificate
- Copy of the identity document of the parents and/or legal guardians
- Affidavit signed by the parent/legal guardian not traveling with the minor. The declaration must be certified by the competent Ministry of Foreign Affairs and translated into Italian for legalization by the consular office.
- In cases where one parent is absent or deceased, supporting documentation must be provided via a birth certificate, death certificate, or court order regarding custody. If the legal guardian is not the biological parent listed on the birth certificate, an official order confirming legal custody must be provided.
- Letter from the school indicating the name of the minor, the names of the parents/legal guardians, the class attended and the contact details of the school representative.
